Our very colourful front cover tells an amazing story that illustrates the wonderful support that Francis House has attracted both in the North West and from around the world. In 2001 a dedicated group of knitters (co-ordinated by Jackie Hadfield) began knitting chicks to cover crème eggs for sale in schools. Two years ago the pattern was published in a European knitting magazine and was also put on the world wide web – Francis House chicks went viral and this year the thousands of chicks knitted raised over twenty seven thousand pounds. Our cover photo shows the various colours of chicks arranged in the symbol of the Rainbow Family.

Chicks have come from America, Australia and across Europe and the Francis House Facebook page has been buzzing. Thousands of people giving their skills freely in order to help our families.

We never cease to be amazed by the dedicated people who support us and we take great pride in the fact that last year over 89p in every pound donated went directly to the care of the children. That is in a large part due to the work of volunteers and the many people on salaries who put in so much extra unpaid time.

As we go to press our new residential project is nearing completion and I have just returned from taking our curtain supplier around to measure up for curtains and blinds.

It is hard to believe that at the beginning of April 2015 we didn't even know that we would have to embark on this exciting new project but since then we have purchased the property, built a new team under the new Registered Manager, Dermot Murphy, provided staff training and employed Contractors to expand the accommodation to make it financially viable.

In order to facilitate this new work, without putting the ever expanding work of Francis House and Lodge at risk, a new subsidiary company has been formed – Francis House Families Ltd.

Whilst the building work progresses the current residents have been living at Francis Lodge and the whole building seems to be splitting at the seams. Francis House and 463 staff have managed to work well together and much has been learnt on both sides.

The extended building will accommodate seven residents, who for one reason or another can't be looked after by their families or live independently. Their care is paid for through social and healthcare budgets and so the facility should be virtually self-supporting.

The real joy has been seeing some of the young people getting ready in the morning to go out to college, one even does some shifts in the shop! The aim as always at Francis House is to allow young people to live their lives as fully as their conditions permit.

We hope that the residents will return to the newly expanded building in August/September and anticipate that by October there will be seven residents.

A big thank you to the staff of both teams for being so professional under very trying circumstances.



# RUNNING FOR FRANCIS HOUSE

Two of our significant running events have taken place over the last two months. April saw the Virgin Money London Marathon. Eight runners competed on behalf of Francis House, Charlotte Bailey, Iain Brooks, Lyndsey Hay, Laura Stafford, Sarah Coombs, Helen Bly, Paul Horrocks and Ellie McKinnon who between them raised an incredible £20,200.00.



On the 22nd May over 300 runners took part in the Great Manchester Run together with a further 80 who ran in memory of Kirsty Howard. Kirsty had always worn the No. 1 shirt and this number has been retired from further runs as a tribute to her.

Not one to watch from the side lines our own Emma Rapley, Fundraiser took part finishing in a respectable time of 59 minutes.

Francis House had a gold spot in the Charity Village in Albert Square where we were able to greet and encourage runners who were running for us. Runners ranged from corporate teams to families running in memory of someone who had been cared for at Francis House.

Money is still coming in but so far we have raised £38,000.00.

Fairground, games, community choirs and dancing groups provided entertainment and Market Street was filled with food and craft stalls.




