We also sadly report the death of another long serving kitchen volunteer, Ron Gratton who has been with us since the early years. Regular, committed people who have worked hard to provide the stability that our families need.

Since Sister Aloysius managed to 'balance the books' we have continued to expand and develop our services but have always ensured that our new ventures are sustainable, long term. There have been many reports of hospices struggling to remain open – some have had to reduce services or even close. These are difficult and uncertain economic times. It is not easy to find the funds to run this continuously growing organisation – but the need for our services grows year on year and Francis House aims to serve the people of the North West for a long time to come.

Stability is our watch word; we have dedicated people like Sheila and Colin and Ron who give their time freely. We have a stable group of Trustees who ensure good stewardship and governance.

We have used the same contractors and professional consultants who have given so much more than the professional service that you could normally expect.

KIELDER CONQUERED

When children and their families come to Francis House, they soon discover that what we offer extends far beyond the hospice walls - we are here to give people opportunities and experiences that they have never had before.

Each year some of our young people join up with other hospice users from Martin House and Derian House at Calvert Kielder in Northumberland for an outdoor activity break.

During their three-night chalet stay, Daniel, Luke and Ben together with members of staff Nicola, Sara and Carrie put on a Mexican themed party night. Dressed in sombreros and ponchos they played games and tucked into tasty meals they had prepared for the whole group.

For Nicola Ward, Registered Nurse and member of the senior hospice team, it was also her first experience of Kielder.

She explained: "It was a real highlight for me to have a job where I can take these young people away on holiday. It's wonderful that it's equipped for them so that they can engage in all the activities that their peers can do."

The group took a tour around the lake, explored the forest by golf buggy and showed off their archery skills using assisted trigger switches to fire the bows.



"The young people loved it and got real pleasure and enjoyment which you could see in their body language and expressions. For the theme night we had made all the decorations and they were so excited about delivering our party, they enjoyed the whole experience and it was a privilege to be part of that."

"One of the young people Daniel was anxious before going on the trip, he needed reassurance as did his mum which is understandable. You are being entrusted with the most precious gift - their child. But he really came out of his shell and it was lovely to watch him grow in confidence and self-esteem."

Luke, Ben and Daniel took part in activities like the King Swing. Strapped in a harness and pulled backwards to a height of 50 feet before being let go was a real test of their bravery. "Daniel gave me the biggest surprise when he was the first to get on the King Swing. You'd have never of thought he would do it, but he did. He was so proud of himself and the young people were applauding him on, it really enhanced his confidence."

"For our young people just having the opportunity to go on a holiday like that might be the only one that they get. This was an experience I'll never forget."

TO NEW HEIGHTS

With a love of children and a passion for dance Lynda Cardwell has inspired hundreds of families.

The Cardwell Theatre School, based in Altrincham, has been nurturing young musical talent for more than four decades. From tiny tots to teenagers, former students regularly reach the dizzy heights of performing in West End Shows and classical ballet companies and running their own dance studios.

Urmston resident, grandmother and Principal Examiner for the I.D.T.A - International Dance Teachers Association, Lynda heard about Francis House from a parent of a pupil whose sister regularly used the hospice for respite care.

She explained: "The children that come to the theatre school are fortunate in so many ways and the children at Francis House face such enormous difficulties. I thought it was good for the pupils here to know about the hospice and to appreciate what other families face so we started the fundraising."

The theatre school holds an annual performance in aid of Francis House which raises thousands of pounds. Fundraiser Kate Puc has attended every performance since Lynda began her support.

"Kate is absolutely amazing at her job and makes everybody feel valued and 18 years later we are still here."

Earlier this year in what Lynda, 63, describes as a 'mad moment' she decided to jump out of a plane in order to further boost support.

"I typed my plan to do a skydive into the theatre school newsletter which then committed me. I'm terrified of heights and not a great fan of flying but it seemed like a good idea. A great response came from the board of directors of the I.D.T.A - they really liked the idea of me jumping out of a plane and donated £3.000."

Lynda's bravery has boosted the fundraising total to a staggering £106,000!

Watched by her son Simon and his young family and other son Gary via mobile phone in Australia - daredevil Lynda made a perfect landing.

"I wasn't nervous on the day. I think the theatrics took over as there was a camera and I thought I'd better smile. I loved it and wanted to do it again, but I woke up the next day and every part of my body was in agony – including my teeth!"

The family have had first-hand experience of the support of a hospice and Lynda's late husband

took part in social events and repairs around the theatre school.

"Tony was as passionate about raising money for Francis House through the school as I was - he supported it 100%. The thing with hospices is that everybody in that building just gets it. The other people know what you are going through, the staff understand you, people don't talk in whispers and will give you a hug when you need it."

WALKING THE WALL

Friends from the football fanzine 'United We Stand' Anthony Shaw from Oldham and Andrew Lindsay from Prestwich, hit upon the idea of a walking challenge after their friend Andy Mitten completed a cycle ride from Barcelona to Manchester to raise money for an adult Hospice.

Anthony, a Special Educational Needs and Disability manager, and BBC Sport broadcaster Andrew, funded their own travel and accommodation on the four-day, 88 mile, coast to coast Hadrian's Wall Path



Carrying all their kit and food for the journey, they encountered blistering 30-degree heat, torrential downpours, stinging nettles and even charging cows to reach their destination in Wallsend, Tyne and Wear.

Margaret Vinten MBE, the founder of Derian House Children's Hospice, died at the age of 80 on the 6th June.



A former nurse, Margaret was the inspiration behind Derian House in Chorley after being approached by a family in 1991 who wanted to open a children's hospice.

A highly respected member of the community, Margaret and Sister Aloysius became good friends and both women went on to become the driving forces behind two of the North West's children's hospices.

MAKE A WILL

Did you know almost £1 million of the £4 million that we need to fund our work each year comes from bequests?

We are very grateful to be remembered in the hearts of so many people from across the north west who kindly leave us a gift in their Will.

Among them Derek Walton deserves our special thanks.

Born on the 18th July 1943, Derek was a keen runner and a long-standing member of the Altrincham & District Athletic Club (ADAC) and Northern Veterans.

A former Altrincham Grammar School pupil, Derek worked in hospital finance and in his twenties he became hooked on running regularly covering 90 miles a week. In 1966 he ran his first marathon before becoming the ADAC's first male county champion when winning the Cheshire 20 mile title.

As a veteran Derek went from strength to strength rarely suffering injury and ran his 100th marathon in 1995.

Retirement allowed him to make his mark in endurance events - travelling to many countries overseas including South Africa where he competed in the Two Oceans race, a distance of over 50 miles.

He was often quoted as saying 'It's better to wear out than rust out.'

Derek was also a blood donor and was honoured aged 73 by NHS Blood and Transplant for donating blood 100 times

He lived in Timperley and died aged 74. His cousin Stella Blackburn says: "Derek was a very caring and generous person. We grew up together and he was like a brother to me. He was loved by many long-standing friends and he also loved children."

Derek very kindly bequeathed the sum of £312,303.79 to Francis House.
