WELCOME TO OUR FAMILY



By now most people will have heard that I have announced my retirement from the role of Chief Executive some time during 2025. This long period of notice is necessary to allow the Trustees time to select my successor (the process has already begun).

It is not without sadness that I have made this decision. I have been privileged to hold this post for twenty years and as most of you know Francis House has been a big part of my life since the inception of the charity back in 1989.

During this time I have made so many friendships, the children and young people and their families, staff, visiting professionals, loyal contractors, fundraisers and of course the volunteers. I cannot begin to thank you all for your dedication and commitment to the families, your support for the hospice and for your ongoing encouragement.

This has been a tremendous journey with many remarkable people involved and together we have achieved so much! Thank you's seem inadequate.

The Trustees have a difficult task because Francis House is unique amongst the Childrens Hospices, having had only two CEOs in 35 years.

We have achieved so much together, the building and establishment of Francis House, ensuring financial stability, the construction of Francis Lodge for teenagers and young adults, the opening of 463 as a residential unit and in February we marked the first anniversary of the

opening of 92, a residential facility for young adults with extremely complex needs.

None of this is down to any one person, it has been a huge team effort and together we have changed the lives of thousands of families all of whom have been given the heartbreaking diagnosis that their child has a life-limiting or life-threatening condition.

One of my favourite quotes over the years came from an eighteen year old young lady who had terminal cancer, she said –

"I thought that I was coming to Francis House to die, I now realise that I came here to live!"

Francis House has established a worldwide reputation for excellence. What we have done together is

truly remarkable. Everyone of you, whatever your involvement, will be in my prayers. I'm sure that you will give the same encouragement, support and friendship to my successor that you have afforded Sister Aloysius and myself.

Thank you, everybody, whatever your involvement, may God bless everyone who uses or who is involved in any way with Francis House. It is God's work that we do.

We hope to see as many of you as possible at our Open Day on the 22nd April.

Number 92, a care home in Heaton Moor provides a supportive living environment to young people with life-limiting conditions and complex needs. Launched in February last vear, and operated by Francis House Families Ltd, number 92 is now the permanent residence of six young people who were previously cared for by their parents full-time.

Dermot Murphy is the Registered Manager and has a passion for pioneering initiatives in social care and developing and improving services.

Dermot says: "It's been a remarkable achievement to get number 92 fully staffed and all the young people in. It's a tremendously difficult transition for a young person to leave home where they have lived all their lives and move to be cared for by other people. We have received an awful lot of trust from the parents, and we are enormously grateful for that.

"Because we staged it in the way that we have and none of it has been rushed, we've managed to get to know each of the six young people as individuals as they moved in. It's

been a joy to see them develop, their personalities blossom, and to see most of the families take up opportunities that weren't available to them before because they're not having to act as carers. The extent that it has changed those family's lives has been remarkable."

Fiona Ferguson's daughter Elizabeth, aged 20, moved into number 92 in April 2023. For the first couple of months Fiona continued to take her to and from college. Reassured with the progress the staff were making in caring for Elizabeth she soon felt able to let go.

"I was very hands on in the early days," says Fiona "It's been nice that I've been able to take a big step back now. It didn't take long for me to feel comfortable and relaxed enough to not have to think about Elizabeth's

"It's been a new experience for both Elizabeth and I, and she is getting to do things that I would never have dreamt of doing with her and she loves it. She's living like a 20-year-old should, rather than with me. She gets choices and options now with the staff there. Her world has opened up to new experiences and she's living with friends the same age."



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After twenty years of being a fulltime carer, Fiona has a job that she loves and is working with adults with learning disabilities at a day centre.

She added: "For me I've got peace of mind which is my biggest takeaway and I know the care she gets is just exceptional. Elizabeth is in this house now where she'll be forever more, and receive the best care that she can, and for me as her mum it's just unbelievable."

An open door policy means that parents can visit at any time or simply have a chat with the staff. A team of 23 provide round the clock care with Angela Doyle as Clinical Lead.

Angela says: "It's going really well and from the parents' perspective they are starting to see a different side of their loved ones - things they probably wouldn't have seen before from a social engagement point of view.

"We've taken the young people out to a karaoke at a local pub and the community were really engaged in wanting them involved and up on the stage.

"Whenever we have opportunities that we come across, we're pushing as hard as we can, and people are starting to identify what they can offer us." Trips to the barbers for haircuts and nails painted at the beauty salon are now possible thanks to the efforts of the staff who are keen to integrate the young people within the community and give them the full experience.

"The needs of the young people are complex and unique. We're liaising with the colleges, the local authorities, sourcing music therapy and other areas that possibly weren't explored in the past. There is so much scope here now it's amazing," says Angela.

Income for the residential facility, operated by Francis House Families Ltd, comes from the individual residents Local Authority Care Budget. All of the young people can continue to receive respite care and symptom control at the Hospice.

Chief Executive of Francis House, Revd David Ireland, has announced that he will be retiring in 2025.

As a former architect, David Ireland has always had grand designs for Francis House. That is because he only wanted the best for the children, young adults and their families who use the hospice.

David created Francis House, quite literally, in his role as architect for the project to turn a convent into a hospice in 1990. David became enamoured with Francis House where every decision is made with the welfare of the family at heart.

Following the retirement of Sister Alovsius, the founder of Francis House in 2005. David took on the role of chief executive.

David's extraordinary contribution to Francis House during the last 30 years is featured in a new book 'A Worthwhile Error - The History of Francis House' along with fascinating chapters on the

Rebecca says: "It rubbed off on us and because dad was so passionate, we became passionate. "Dad was a humble man who didn't want any fuss or thanks for what he did, but he would have been thrilled to have received this award for outstanding support. We are delighted and proud to accept it," said Rebecca.
